JONES ACT JOBS INTEGRAL PART OF LABOR DAY

As America pauses to honor its working men and women, it's important to remember that so many of those family-sustaining jobs exist because the Jones Act reserves domestic waterborne commerce in vessels that are U.S.-crewed, U.S.-built, and U.S.-owned. American Maritime Partnership ("AMP") is the voice of the U.S. domestic maritime industry, a pillar of our nation's economic, national, and homeland security. More than 40,000 American vessels built in American shipyards, crewed by American mariners, and owned by American companies, ply our waters 24/7, and this commerce sustains nearly 500,000 jobs, \$29 billion in labor compensation, and more than \$100 billion in annual economic output according to a study by PricewaterhouseCoopers for the Transportation Institute. So efficient are these vessels that they carry a quarter of the nation's cargo for only 2 percent of the national freight bill, and being American owned, built and crewed helps make America more secure.
